The cost is approximately \$900 per semester. The actual rates will be determined a few months prior to the start of the school year. Students with cars are legally required to have automobile insurance and a valid Hawaii state driver's licence or a current international driver's license.	

Visa Information	All exchange students must have a valid passport and an F-1 student visa. The university will provide an I-20 to be used to get the visa from a U.S. Embassy or Consulate. Students must bring the I-20 and passport when entering the United States.		
Pre-Arrival Information CONTACT INFORMATION	Accepted students will be contacted directly by the Center for Global Education and Exchange as well as the Director of International Student Services with information about arrival and orientation. Students should be sure to read all emails very carefully. Airport pickup is available on designated days prior to orientation. Those dates will be announced by email after students have been accepted. Students who arrive outside of the designated pickup dates can take a taxi to the campus from the airport. The campus is about 15 minutes from the airport and the taxi ride costs \$15-\$20.
